Penta Helix Collaboration for Sustainable Tourism in Tutuala, Timor Leste

Abstract: Abstract: Penta Helix collaboration is an important approach in developing sustainable tourism destinations, especially in areas where natural and cultural tourism potential is not yet optimal, such as Tutuala, Lautem, and Timor Leste Districts. This study aims to identify, analyze, and systematize literature related to the role of Penta Helix—which includes government, academics, business, communities, and media—in supporting sustainable tourism development in the region. Using the Systematic Literature Review (SLR) method, this article examines various previous studies to map cross-sector collaboration in increasing tourist attractions and their impacts on environmental, social, and economic sustainability. The results of the study show that the active involvement of each Penta Helix element is very influential in strengthening destination governance (Dredge & Jenkins, 2019; Yusran et al., 2020), expanding the tourism market (Sigala, 2020; Truong & Hall, 2021), and improving the quality of life of local communities (Goodwin, 2019; Cruz et al., 2021). However, challenges related to coordination between stakeholders and limited resources are still major obstacles in implementing this collaborative strategy (Jamal & Stronza, 2019). Therefore, stronger synergy efforts are needed, as well as the role of the media in promoting tourism potential and raising awareness of the importance of sustainability in tourism.

INTRODUCTION

Tutuala District, located at the eastern tip of Timor-Leste, has significant natural and cultural tourism potential, including the Nino Konis Santana National Park and rich archaeological sites. Sustainable tourism development in this area is essential to maximize this potential without disrupting the ecological and social balance (Khan et al., 2020; McKercher & du Cros, 2021). Sustainable tourism supports local economic growth by creating jobs and promoting local products, in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which emphasize the balance between economic growth, environmental sustainability, and social

inclusion (Carlsen et al., 2020). In the context of Timor-Leste, sustainable tourism development can also play a key role in advancing the national economy, while maintaining cultural authenticity and natural sustainability (Dwyer et al., 2021).

The Penta Helix concept offers a collaborative approach involving five main elements: government, academics, business actors, communities, and media, which together can support sustainable tourism development (Carlsen et al., 2020). The government acts as a policy maker and development facilitator, while academics contribute through research and development of innovations in the tourism sector (Tajeddini et al., 2020). Business actors play an important role in providing environmentally friendly products and services and supporting the local economy through sustainable business practices (Hudson & Hudson, 2020). Local communities are the main guardians of cultural and environmental sustainability, who are directly involved in the provision of community-based tourism products (Lechner & Dowling, 2020). On the other hand, the media plays a role in promoting destinations globally and educating the public about the importance of sustainable tourism (Sigala, 2021). Through this approach, Penta Helix is able to create effective collaboration to maximize the potential of tourist destinations such as Tutuala District, while maintaining environmental, social, and economic balance (McKercher & du Cros, 2021).

Thus, sustainable tourism development in Tutuala District requires the integration of various stakeholders as a whole, as well as a holistic and targeted approach (Aas et al., 2019). Amidst the enormous potential of natural and cultural tourism, good management is the key to preventing negative impacts such as environmental exploitation and cultural degradation (Tajeddini et al., 2020). As a destination that is still in the development stage, Tutuala District has a great opportunity to highlight its authentic characteristics as the main attraction, where sustainable development can have a positive impact on the lives of local people and maintain the sustainability of its natural resources (Dwyer et al., 2021).

Ultimately, the Penta Helix concept emerged as an ideal framework to integrate the roles of various stakeholders (Aas et al., 2019). Through collaboration between government, academics, business actors, communities, and the media, each sector can leverage their expertise and resources to drive more synergistic development (Carlsen et al., 2020). The government must lead with clear regulations and support innovation, academics provide theoretical and practical foundations through research, businesses implement business models that support sustainability, and communities maintain local tourism attractions, both from an environmental and cultural perspective (Lechner & Dowling, 2020). The media, with its communication power, plays a vital role in disseminating information and educating the wider community about Tutuala's tourism potential and the importance of protecting the environment (Sigala, 2021).

With good coordination and synergy between stakeholders, challenges such as limited infrastructure, lack of human resource capacity, and low awareness of sustainable tourism can be overcome. Collective efforts from each stakeholder will not only strengthen the tourism sector in the region but also ensure long-term environmental, social, and economic sustainability (Aas et al., 2019; McKercher & du Cros, 2021).

The purpose of this study is to understand the role and contribution of each element of the Penta Helix—including government, academics, business actors, communities, and media—in supporting sustainable tourism development in Tutuala District, Lautem, Timor Leste. Through this study, it is hoped that a comprehensive view can be obtained regarding the importance of cross-sectoral collaboration and effective strategies in optimizing the potential of tourist destinations.

METHOD

In this study, the researcher will use a qualitative method with a single case study approach to deeply understand stakeholder collaboration in the Penta Helix framework for sustainable tourism destination development in Tutuala District, Dili, Timor Leste. However, for MSME research, the Systematic Literature Review (SLR) method will be used to identify, evaluate, and synthesize relevant literature. SLR was chosen because it provides a systematic, transparent, and replicable approach in collecting and assessing existing literature (Snyder, 2019).

To support the method used, the author uses the Pentahelix approach as a practical framework in data collection or analysis. The Pentahelix framework model in this study can be seen as follows:

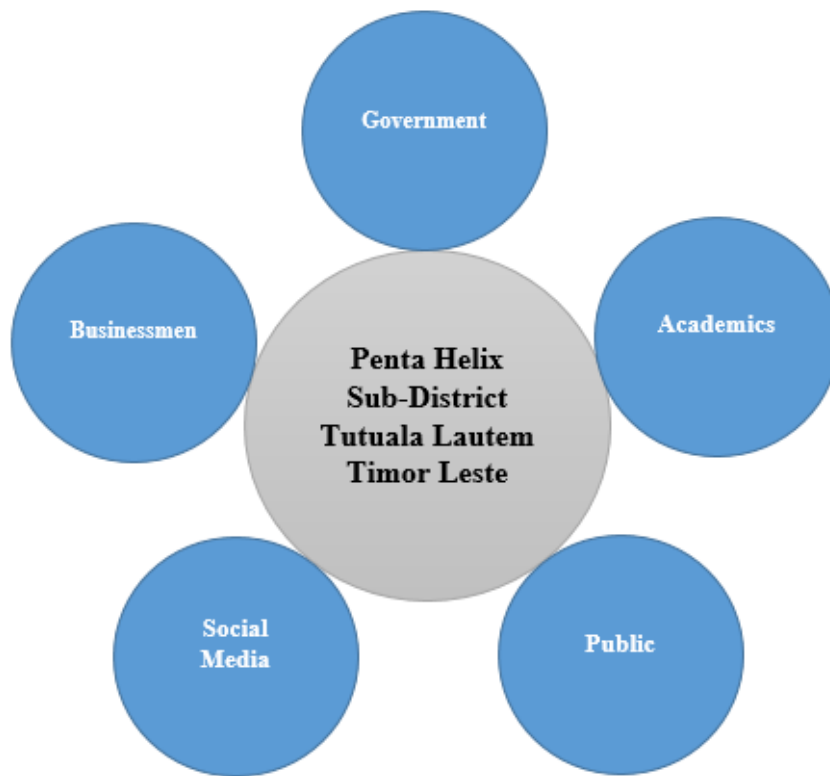


Figure 1. Research Flow Diagram

The Penta Helix model in the context of sustainable tourism development, as implemented in Tutuala District, Lautem, Timor Leste, is a collaborative approach involving five main elements, namely government, academics, business actors, communities, and the media. This collaboration between stakeholders aims to create synergy in developing tourism destinations that are not only competitive but also socially, economically, and environmentally sustainable.

1. Government: The government plays an important role in establishing policies and regulations that support sustainable tourism development. In addition, the government is also responsible for building basic infrastructure such as road access, security, and other

- public facilities that support the tourism sector (Dredge & Jamal, 2021; Rozhkova et al., 2020).
2. **Academics:** Academics contribute through research and development of innovations relevant to destination management. Research from academics is very helpful in providing data and analysis on tourism impacts and in offering evidence-based recommendations for sustainable development strategies (Carter et al., 2023; Pham et al., 2021).
 3. **Businessman:** The business sector plays a role as a driver of the local economy by providing services and products for tourists, such as accommodation, transportation, and food. Business actors are also responsible for implementing sustainable business practices, such as waste management and efficient use of resources (Moreno-Izquierdo et al., 2022; Torres-Delgado & Saarinen, 2021).

Communities who are actively involved will not only feel ownership of the tourist destination, but will also be more motivated to preserve the local environment and culture (Simangunsong & Mahfud, 2021; Dangi & Jamal, 2020).

Media helps disseminate information about the potential and challenges faced in developing tourism destinations, as well as in building a positive image for the destination (Kim et al., 2022; García-Rosell et al., 2021).

Overall, the Penta Helix model enables inter-sectoral synergies that strengthen sustainable tourism destination management. This collaboration also has the potential to reduce challenges such as resource constraints and lack of awareness of sustainability (Harilal et al., 2023; Dangi et al., 2022).

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

After conducting a search based on keywords and inclusion criteria, relevant articles were then filtered through several stages. The first stage is filtering based on title and abstract. Articles or journals whose titles are not relevant or do not match the focus of the research will be eliminated using the VOSviewer program (Moher et al., 2019; Kitchenham & Charters, 2019).

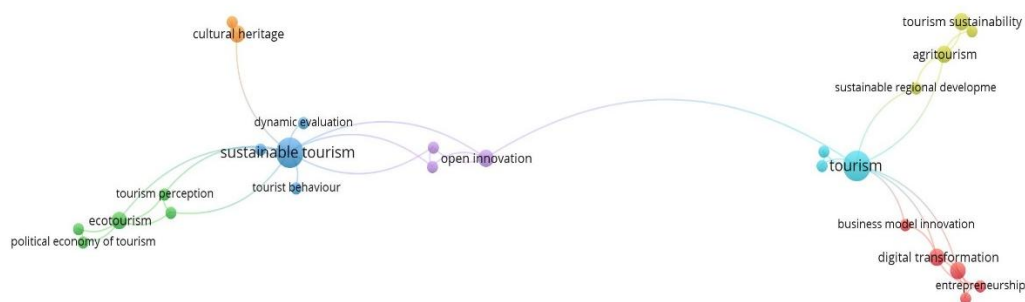


Figure 2. Vos Viewer improves Network Visualization

The second stage, full text evaluation. Articles that pass the first stage will be read in full to determine their relevance to this research, based on references (name, year, title preferably using Zotero/Mendeley software), problems studied, objectives/formulation of

research problems, methods, important conclusions, and implications of findings in the journal (Kitchenham & Charters, 2019; Moher et al., 2019). The third stage, critical assessment. Articles that pass the selection will be assessed based on the quality of the research methodology and their contribution to the topic discussed, namely stakeholder collaboration in Penta Helix for sustainable tourism destination development (Moher et al., 2019).

Reporting Findings

The results of the literature synthesis will be presented in a systematic narrative form, covering key findings related to stakeholder collaboration within the Penta Helix framework for sustainable tourism destination development in Tutuala District. The findings will be presented thematically based on the roles of each stakeholder, challenges, and opportunities in collaboration, as well as policy implications and practical recommendations for future tourism development (Petticrew & Roberts, 2006; Kitchenham & Charters, 2007; Moher et al., 2009).

The stages in conducting SLR require various strategic steps and methods in searching for references related to the intended research. At this stage, it will be included with search keywords.

The literature search keywords in this study are The first method is to identify relevant literature studies through searches on leading academic databases, such as Google Scholar, Scopus, Web of Science, ProQuest, and ScienceDirect. The identified literature studies will focus on the topics of stakeholder collaboration, the Penta Helix concept, and sustainable tourism development. In addition, studies related to the context of Timor Leste or regions with similar characteristics are also part of the search process. The selection is based on stages, namely the first is selecting publishers, the second is identifying and analyzing literature abstracts, the third stage is identifying and analyzing through literature output. The selection is carried out by inclusion and exclusion with the criteria as shown in Table 1.

In the 2nd review section, an analysis of the article content is carried out. This review stage is carried out by analyzing the abstracts of several remaining journals, then: 1) eliminating literature with abstracts that are not related to the keywords specified by the author; 2) eliminating literature with main problems, research methodology that falls into the method category. machine learning models on fraud in online financial transactions; 3) Removal of articles with content or paper formats that are too general.

The remaining results in Review 2 will be grouped based on the information system development method used. Then in the final stage, the researcher conducts a selection. The results of the selection are by assessing the quality of the paper based on the Quality Assessment (QA) list.

The Role of Penta Helix Elements in Sustainable Tourism Development

In the context of sustainable tourism development in Tutuala District, the role of each element of the Penta Helix is very important. The government acts as a regulator and facilitator, which establishes policies and regulations that support environmentally friendly and sustainable tourism development. Media serves as an important information channel, helping to promote destinations and build awareness about sustainable tourism. Media that actively supports sustainability campaigns can influence public perception and increase tourists' interest in visiting the destination (Buhalis & Mendes, 2019).

Challenges in Stakeholder Collaboration

While there are many benefits to stakeholder collaboration in the Penta Helix, there are also challenges that need to be addressed. One of the main challenges is the lack of effective communication between stakeholders. Research shows that poor communication can hinder the collaboration process and lead to misunderstandings between the parties involved (Lechner & Dowling, 2020).

Limited resources also a significant barrier to collaboration.
